

Typical Degree Progression

YEAR	PROGRAM
FIRST	 4-week math preparation course 3 three-quarter sequences in Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, and Econometrics Achieve candidacy by achieving a satisfactory GPA in each sequence (No Prelim!)
SECOND	 Field sequences Economic history course & paper Attend departmental research workshops Start working on first paper for student seminar If necessary, retake some first-year courses to improve GPA and achieve candidacy

Typical Degree Progression

YEAR	PROGRAM
THIRD	 Audit other courses of interest Present two papers in student seminar (Fall and Spring) Dissertation prospectus (defense of proposal) (June/July/August)
FOURTH	 Work on thesis Present 1-2 times in student lunch in field of choice Participate in reading groups & advising groups Meeting regularly with committee members

YEAR	PROGRAM
FIFTH or SIXTH	 Continued work on thesis Draft of job market paper by start of year Present job market paper internally in fall ASSA meetings and interviews Job offer Thesis defense (May) Degree conferred in June (or in August or December) Fame and fortune await


